

Workshop to develop self-awareness

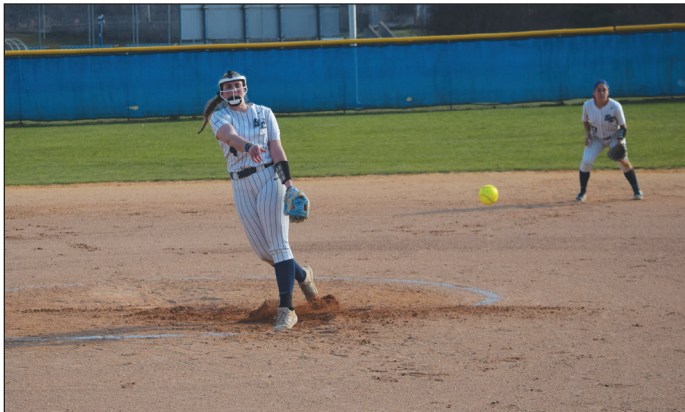

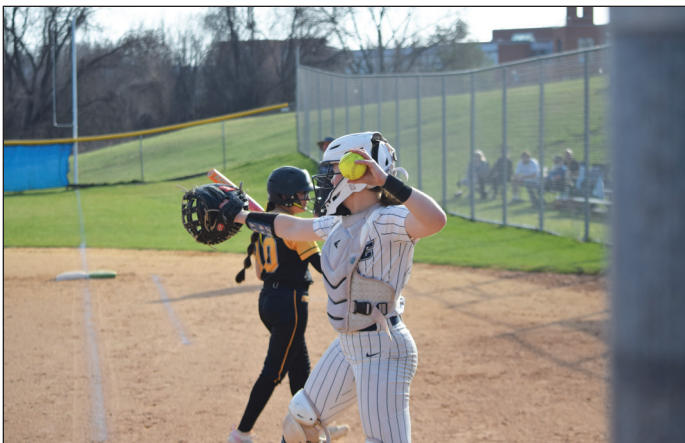
